Then the Master Naturalist Program is for you!

The training programs begin on August 18, 2011 and are then held on Tuesdays starting August 30th and some Saturdays through November 1, 2011.

Topics include Ecological Concepts, Geology, Soils and Water Properties, Weather and Climate, Nature Photography, Texas Eco-regions, Botany, Ichthyology, Herpetology & Amphibians, Entomology, Ornithology, Wetland and Forest Ecologies, Texas Mammals, and Predator-Prey Relationship.

Field trips include Native Plants at a local ranch, Indian Pictographs at Paint Rock, Rangeland Ecology at a local ranch, Quail Biology at the Rolling Plains Quail Research Ranch, and Bird Watching at the Abilene State Park.

The Master Naturalist program is a network of volunteer organizations that work with Texas AgriLife Extension Service, Texas Parks and Wildlife and local organizations, to learn and teach others about Texas' natural resources. Through the Master Naturalist program, participants are able to learn how all parts of nature work together to make Texas a unique and wonderful place, and then to pass that knowledge on to others.
