

The Texas Master Gardener Program



The Texas Master Gardener Program is a volunteer development program of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service. Master Gardener volunteers receive in-depth horticultural training. In return, they provide volunteer service through AgriLife Extension by delivering horticultural education to their communities. Program participants should be able to communicate with the public by telephone, personal contact, as a speaker or through written correspondence. Master Gardener volunteers serve as "horticultural docents" supervised by AgriLife Extension personnel who assign, review, and facilitate volunteer work.

Step 1: To gain the title of Master Gardener Intern, a Trainee

- receives a minimum of fifty (50) hours of instruction
- passes an examination

The volunteer aspect of the Master Gardener program allows individuals to dedicate their time and talents to educate and enhance their local community utilizing the science and art of horticulture.

Step 2: Master Gardener Interns:

- give 50 hours of volunteer service in AgriLife Extension initiated projects in Taylor County and surrounding areas within **one year** of their **training date**
- are certified as a Master Gardener when all requirements are met

Step 3: **Re-certification** of a Big Country Master Gardener is an annual process that requires:

- 6 Volunteer Extension hours
- 12 Volunteer Community Service hours
- 6 Continuing Education hours

Important information:

- Cost: Cost of the training is \$200.00 payable by February 10, 2022, following acceptance into the Big Country Master Gardener Intern Program.
- Classes run by February 10th through April 26th. See page 5 for tentative schedule.
- Most classes will be held at the Taylor County AgriLife Extension office on the Taylor County Fairgrounds except for 1 Saturday class that will be held near Abilene Christian University.
- **Minors:** You must be 18 or older to take the course, unless accompanied by a parent who is also taking the course.
- **Refunds:** No refunds will be given after the beginning of the first session.
